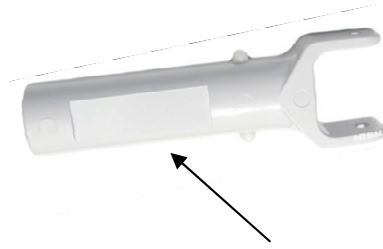




Vac Plate



This part is attached to the vac head

Insert this end into the pole
The buttons will pop out when aligned with the holes on the pole

You'll want to use the skimmer with the strongest suction (generally, the one closest to the pump)

Keep the basket in the skimmer

The **swivel end** of the hose goes onto the vac head

The **stationary end** of the hose goes onto the vac plate

Attach the pole to the vac head, rotate until the little buttons will pop out to keep it attached

Once you have all of that put together you need to prime the vac hose

Put the vac head into the pool close to the skimmer. I kind of wrap my arm around the pole to keep it from falling into the pool.

Feed the hose in thru your hands into the pool so the hose fills with water.

Once you get close to the end of the hose, you can hear the water come up and might even see some in the vac plate.

Quickly take the vac plate and place it in the skimmer so it's over the basket.

You're ready to vacuum.

You can turn the pump off and then on to release the vac plate from the skimmer.

If you unscrew the knurled nut around the pole, you can increase the length of the pole.
